Player to Watch

Tyler Buchner, QB

The new starting quarterback for the Fighting Irish has plenty of unknowns surrounding him. For starters, Buchner finished with more rushing yards than passing yards last season. But the dual-threat QB has the backing of Marcus Freeman and OC Tommy Rees. We'll see if Buchner is up to the test right away with a week one battle against the Ohio State Buckeyes. If so, only Clemson presents a challenge to Notre Dame the rest of the way.

Breakdown *Marcus Spears*

Last season the Fighting Irish dominated with an 11-2 record, finishing #8 in the AP poll after a close loss to the Oklahoma State Cowboys in the Fiesta Bowl, with interim coach Marcus Freeman taking the reins after head coach Brian Kelly left for LSU. After the game, Notre Dame would announce defensive coordinator Freeman would permanently take the head coaching position. The hopes are the Irish can remain one of the top teams in college football.

In his first year, Coach Freeman decided to add experience to his coaching staff, adding former Miami Hurricanes head coach Al Golden as defensive coordinator. On the offensive side of the ball, Tommy Rees remains the offensive coordinator, with some new additions to the staff, adding Deland McCullough and Gerad Parker to the staff. Coach McCullough adds 11 years of experience as a running back coaching college and the NFL with Indiana, USC and the Kansas City Chiefs. As tight ends coach, Coach Parker adds 15 years in college football to the staff. Defensively with the additions to Golden, the coaching staff also added Al Washington, who's coached several defensive positions in college football as the defensive line coach.

There is some talent to work with for the Irish, with recently announced sophomore quarterback Tyler Buchner as the starter. Wide receivers Lorenzo Styles, Avery Davis and Lenzy Braden, will be there to throw to. The hopes are one can fill the void left by Kevin Austin, who led the core last season. The three combined for 83 receptions and 1080 yards with eight touchdowns. Buchner will still have safety net junior tight end Michael Mayer to throw to, who caught 71 passes for 840 yards with seven TDS. RB Chris Tyree will get an opportunity to take the reins as the starter replacing Kyren Williams. In limited time last season, Tyree had success as a dual three back rushing for 222 yards and receiving 24 receptions for 258 yards as the backup last season.

Defensively senior pass rusher Isaiah Foskey led the Irish in sacks last season with 10 and returns to continue his success. JD Bertrand led the Irish in tackles with 102 and wants to continue his success in finishing plays around the line of scrimmage.

At 35 years old, Coach Freeman is currently the third youngest FBS head coach in the country and the second ever African American to lead the Irish. With high expectations, experienced staff and the ability to relate to younger players, things will surely be interesting in South Bend this season.
